The Barnet (Edgware) (On-Street Parking Places) (No.1) (Amendment No. 15) Traffic Order 2007

The Barnet (West Hendon) (On-Street Parking Places) (No.1) (Amendment No.13) Traffic Order 2007

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Barnet have made on 9th August 2007 the above mentioned Orders under Sections 45, 49, 51, 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers.

The general effect of the Orders will be to make changes to the on-street parking layout within the Edgware and West Hendon Controlled Parking Zones as follows:

1. the resident permit parking place outside Nos. 101 and 103 Fairfield Crescent, Edgware will be reduced in length in order to accommodate an access to an off-street parking facility at No. 103 Fairfield Crescent.
2. the resident permit parking place outside Nos. 21 and 23 Manor Park Gardens, Edgware will be reduced in length to accommodate an access to an off-street parking facility at No. 23 Manor Park Gardens.
3. the resident permit parking place outside Nos. 6 to 16 Audley Road NW4 will be reduced in length in order to accommodate an access to an off-street parking facility at No 16 Audley Road NW4.

Copies of the Orders which will come into operation on Monday 20th August 2007, plans of the relevant areas and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Orders can be inspected between 9am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive for a period of 6 weeks from the date on which this notice is published at:

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Orders or any of its provisions on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
