

LONDON BOROUGH OF BARNET

The Barnet (Golders Green) (Controlled Parking Zone) (Parking Places) (Amendment No. 21) Traffic Order 2010

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Barnet on 18 February 2010 have made the above-mentioned Order under Sections 45, 46, 49, 51 and 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers.

In order to accommodate the introduction of a 'dropped kerb' vehicle crossover to enable access to off-street facilities, the general effect of the above Order will be to modify the existing parking layout at the following location, with a resultant loss of parking spaces as follows:

<u>Location</u>	<u>Parking bay type</u>	<u>No. of spaces removed</u>
Outside No. 20 Elmcroft Avenue, NW11	Resident permit bay	Two
Outside No. 183 West Heath Road, NW3	Resident permit bay	Two

In addition to the above, the Golders Green Order will provide two additional resident permit spaces due to kerb reinstatements between the crossovers of Nos. 183 and 185 West Heath Road. As a result there will be no loss of resident parking places in the road.

A Copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 22 February 2010 and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order can be inspected between 9am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays (Bank Holidays and Public Holidays excepted) for a period of 6 weeks from the date on which this notice is published at:

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of their provisions on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any regulations made there under have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
