The Barnet (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Amendment No. 42) Traffic Order 2010

The Barnet (Mill Hill) (Controlled Parking Zone) (Parking Places) (Amendment No. 3) Traffic Order 2010

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Barnet have made on Thursday 18th February 2010 the above Orders under Sections 6, 45, 46, 49, 51, 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers.

In order to prevent obstructive parking, and improve traffic flow and general road safety, the general effect of the Orders will be to amend loading restrictions as follows:

- the introduction of 'At Any Time' loading restrictions on the south-western side of Millway NW7 at its junction with The Broadway NW7 to prevent parking by disabled badge holders and loading/unloading on the existing double yellow line "At Any Time" waiting restrictions .

Also, the Council is making changes to various free parking places as follows:

- in Beech Walk, Dawes Lane, Downhurst Avenue, Goodwyn Avenue, Limes Avenue, Maxwellton Avenue, Hartley Close, Langley Park, Grenville Place and Victoria Road NW7 by converting existing free bays to resident permit parking places in order to provide additional resident permit parking.

A copy of the Orders, which will come into operation on Monday 15 March 2010, plans of the relevant areas and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Orders can be inspected between 9am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive for a period of 6 weeks from the date on which this notice is published at:

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Orders or any of their provisions on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
