# INTRODUCTION OF A COMMUNITY PARKING PERMIT

### **The Barnet (On-Street Parking Places) Experimental Amendment Order (No. 1) 2008**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Barnet has made on 19<sup>th</sup> June 2008, the above mentioned Order under Sections 9 and 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers

The London Borough of Barnet designate parking places in the Borough at which charges may be made for vehicles to be left in those parking places.

In order to be of assistance to persons carrying out religious duties within the community, the Council are, on an experimental basis, introducing a Community Parking Permit that will enable the permit holder to park in any permitted parking place within the Borough's Controlled Parking Zones.

The annual charge for a Community Parking Permit will be £40 for the first permit and £70 for the second and third permit limited to three valid permits per recognised place of worship.

The Order, which comes into operation for all purposes on 30<sup>th</sup> June 2008 provides that, in pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Chief Executive of the Council or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may, if it appears to him essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs, modify or suspend the operation of the Order or any provision thereof.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

If the provisions of the Order continue in operation for a period of not less than six months, the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely. Anyone who wishes to object to the making of such Order for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the period of six months from the date on which the Order was made, send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Design Team, Building 4, North London Business Park, Oakleigh Road South, London, N11 1NP . In the meantime, while it continues to be in force, the Order and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order can be inspected between 9am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays (Bank Holidays and Public Holidays excepted) at the above address, or at Hendon Library, The Burroughs, Hendon, London NW4 4BQ.
