Interested parties have the right to make a representation, either supporting or objecting to an application. Interested parties are defined as people living or working in the vicinity of the premises concerned. There is no rigid definition of what 'in the vicinity' means, but as a general rule people need to show how they have been personally affected by the licence.

Anonymous representations cannot be accepted. Representations must relate to one or more of the four licensing objectives:

- the prevention of nuisance
- the protection of children from harm
- public safety
- the prevention of crime and disorder

Any person making a relevant representation may include supporting evidence to substantiate their representation.

The council will arrange a licensing sub-committee hearing at which all parties may speak. An interested party may speak at the hearing, or may ask someone to speak on their behalf. Late representations cannot be accepted. Matters not included in the original representation cannot be raised at the hearing.
