REGISTER TO VOTE

You can only vote in elections if your name is on the Register of Electors. We update the register every autumn, but we also add names throughout the year.

Moved Home? Coming up to 18? Or just not on the Register!

All you have to do is fill in the registration form overleaf. If you need a large print version, we can provide this on request. When you send us your form, we will add you to our list of new applications. Any elector can then object to your name being added to the register. If this happens, we will write to you.

If your application is not objected to, we will add / change your details within 7 weeks of receiving your form. We will write to you to tell you your application is allowed.

There is no monthly update during September, October or November during the annual canvass period when all households have to register. A new Register is published on 1st December.

The two versions of the register

The electoral registration officer makes and keeps two versions of the electoral register – the full register and the edited register. **The full register** lists everyone who is entitled to vote. You can check this at the council offices. The Representation of the People (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2002 says who can have a copy of the full register and what they can use it for. This includes electoral purposes, the prevention and detection of crime and checking your identity when you have applied for credit. It is a criminal offence to pass it on to anyone else or to use it for any other purpose. **The edited register** is available for sale to anyone and can be used for any purpose. You can choose not to appear in the edited version of the register by ticking the box overleaf. If you tick the box your name and address will not appear in the register available for general sale.
