REGISTER TO VOTE

You can only vote in elections if your name is on the Register of Electors. We update the register every autumn, but we also add names throughout the year.

Moved Home? Coming up to 18? Or just not on the Register!

All you have to do is fill in the registration form overleaf. If you need a large print version, we can provide this on request. When you send us your form, we will add you to our list of new applications. Any elector can then object to your name being added to the register. If this happens, we will write to you.

If your application is not objected to, we will add / change your details within 7 weeks of receiving your form. We will write to you to tell you your application is allowed.

There is no monthly update during September, October or November during the annual canvass period when all households have to register. A new Register is published on 1st December.

The Full Register lists everyone who is registered to vote. You can check it by calling in to the Electoral Services and some local libraries. Only certain people and organisations can have copies of the Full Register, and they can only use it for specified purposes. These include electoral purposes, the prevention and detection of crime and checking your identity when you have applied for credit. The law says who can have a copy of the Full Register and what they can use it for. The full list of such persons and purposes is given in the Representation of the People (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2002. It is a criminal offence for them to pass it on to anyone else or to use it for any other purpose.

The Edited Register leaves out the names and addresses of people who have asked for them to be excluded from that version of the register. The Edited Register can be bought by anyone who asks for a copy and they may use it for any purpose.
