London is one small example. These have been well articulated in numerous research studies and by central government. The approach to building design within the plan fails to adequately address the seriousness of the current situation and needs to be amended if it is to be found sound. Of particular, but not inclusive note, in recent times is the publication by Historic England "Heritage Counts" in 2020.					
This early research shows that sympathetically upgrading and reusing existing buildings, rather than demolishing and building new, could dramatically improve a building's energy efficiency and would make substantial energy savings because the CO <sub>2</sub> emissions already embodied within existing buildings would not be lost through demolition.					
The logical end of this debate is to seek the creative reuse of all existing buildings in preference to demolition and thus make a key contribution to tackling CO2 increases.
