Barnet council owes residents a duty of care. Road transport already accounts for a significant portion of air pollution in cities and towns. As residents, under the Human Rights Act 1998, we have an inalienable right to life by being able to breathe clean air.

This plan will invariably lead to more cars, more traffic, more congestion, and more pollution. This in turn will equate to poorer air-quality that risk the health of all nearby residents (especially children, and elderly residents, of which there are a number in Langley Park).

During certain times of day, Mill Hill Broadway and its surrounds are packed with cars and traffic. In fact, the meeting of Hale Lane, Bunns Lane and Mill Hill Broadway are already a significant bottleneck at rush hour. This causes significant tail backs and pollution through idling cars.

Moreover, given the councils commitment for environmental sustainability – and given the current congestion around Mill Hill Broadway and Mill Hill Broadway station – the addition of 43 houses and a hotel, will only exacerbate this issue of pollution. This plan as it stands will lower quality of life for residents and potentially put their health at risk. And I object to it.
